

## **Historic Places Associated with Latinos in Nevada, 1864-2000**

Throughout Nevada's history, Latinos have played crucial roles in the state's historical events, development patterns, design and construction. There are many associated Historic Contexts of Latinos in Nevada from 1864 to 2000. All properties evaluated and nominated under this Multi Property Documentation Form (MPDF) have a direct and important association with Latino history in Nevada under Ethnic Heritage.

The following are supporting areas of significance from the historic context which may apply to properties evaluated under this MPDF. As such, areas of significance for various Latino-associated property types will vary by theme. Agriculture: "The process and technology of cultivating soil, producing crops, and raising livestock and plants." Architecture: "The practical art of designing and constructing buildings and structures to serve human needs." Commerce: "The business of trading goods, services, or commodities." Communications: "The technology and process of transmitting information." Education: "The process of conveying or acquiring knowledge or skills through systematic instruction, training, or study." Health/Medicine: "The care of the sick, disabled, and handicapped; the promotion of health and hygiene." Industry: "The technology and process of managing materials, labor, and equipment to produce goods and services." Social History: "The history of efforts to promote the welfare of society; the history of society and the lifeways of its social groups." Transportation: "The process and technology of conveying passengers or materials."
