

Las Vegas Mormon Fort NRHP Nomination Additional Documentation

Edits made from third draft to final report

The main changes were ensuring consistency in time frames. For example, the Bureau of Reclamation (BOR) period was sometimes listed as 1928 to 1933 and other times 1929 to 1933. This was corrected to 1929-1932 throughout the document.

Other changes were ensuring consistent use when identifying Indigenous populations throughout the report, using “Ancestral Puebloan, Nuwuvi (Southern Paiute) and taking out “Patayan.”

There were a few changes to sentence structure in a few paragraphs within Section 7 pages 5-14 but nothing changed the context of the paragraphs.

Section 8, page 27, removed sentence that read, “Knapp rebuilt much of the original fort.” After further research changed to “Knapp adapted the original fort for use as a dwelling and repurposed the central plaza as a corral.”

Section 8, pages 27 through 34, added information regarding a U.S. Post Office at the site and Helen Stewart being formally named the U.S. Postmaster in 1893.

Section 8, page 31, caption on the photograph, added the words “former Stewart Ranch site.”

Section 8, page 33, removed sentence, “Clark assumed responsibility over the railroad’s operation” and replaced with the full second paragraph under Railroad Period....

Section 8, page 36, first paragraph changed wording from, In 1909, Clark County was created from the “southern tip” of Lincoln County to “southern half.”

Section 8, page 42, under Final Ranch Leases under the Railroad changed, “The Union Pacific Railroad had acquired the ranch property from the San Pedro, Los Angeles, and Salt Lake Railroad during the Bureau’s tenancy” to, “For the next two decades after the Bureau of Reclamation departed, ranch leases characterized the property's history as the Union Pacific continued to lease the land.”
