**NRHP Listed or Pending Listing Nominations**

Downtown Winnemucca Historic District, Winnemucca, Humboldt County (NRIS 100012980).  
This nomination was approved by the Board during the March 2026 meeting. Listed by the Keeper in Washington D.C. in the National Register on May 11, 2026.

East Fourth Street Historic District, Reno, Washoe County (NRIS 100012968).  
This nomination was approved by the Board during the March 2026 meeting. Listed by the Keeper in Washington D.C. in the National Register on May 8, 2026.

Florence Crittendon Home, Reno, Washoe County (NRIS 100012962).  
This nomination was approved by the Board during the March 2026 meeting. Listed by the Keeper in Washington D.C. in the National Register on May 4, 2026.

Las Vegas Mormon Fort (NRIS 72000764), Las Vegas, Clark County (Additional Documentation).  
This amended nomination was approved by the Board during the January 23, 2026, meeting. It was submitted to the Keeper in Washington D.C. for review and approval. The City of Las Vegas is updating the nomination based on National Park Service reviewer comments. No Board action is needed, and when accepted, a copy will be sent to the Board for the record.

**NRHP Pending Nominations for BMH Approval**

Boulder City Navy Hangar, Boulder City, Clark County (new nomination).  
Boulder City seeks to list in the National Register of Historic Places the Boulder City Navy Hangar, located at 1401 Boulder City Parkway in Boulder City, Clark County. The Boulder City Navy Hangar is eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places as locally significant under Criterion A, under the theme of *Military*. Bullock Airfield was established in 1933 and supported tourist flights locally of Boulder Dam. With a global conflict brewing, in 1940 the Navy started construction of bases and associated hangars to support bi-coastal flights as part of the military buildup prior to WWII.

The Boulder City Navy Hangar began construction in late 1940 and was completed in early 1941. Under Criterion C, *Architecture*, it is an intact hangar that embodies the distinctive

characteristics and methods of construction of military hangars. The hangar was designed by master architect Albert Kahn through his architecture firm, Albert Kahn Associates. Kahn had a prolific relationship with the federal government starting in World War I. In 1946 the Department of the Navy transferred the airfield back to the Department of the Interior and it became the Boulder City Airport, which closed in 1990. Currently owned by Boulder City, the hangar is used for storage.
